

ALLIED HEALTH TECHNOLOGY

Allied Health Technology is a one-year enrichment program offered to high school seniors. It is designed for college preparatory students who are interested in pursuing a medical or health science career after high school. The program is unique in that it is based in the hospital. Students enrolled in this program will report daily to the hospital where they will receive theoretical and technical instruction. In addition, through a bi-weekly schedule of clinical rotations, students will gain practical experience while working beside the individual professionals in their specific departments. The Allied Health Technology program is a great way for student to test their dreams of becoming health care professionals. This program will take students into major departments of the hospital, such as – Emergency Room, Nursing Care Units, Medical Laboratory, Medical Imaging, Respiratory Care, Pharmacy, Cardiology, Physical Therapy, Intensive Care, and Operating Room.

Criteria for Admission—Students should apply for admission while in 11th grade. Only twenty four students (12 per session) will be accepted into this program each year. GPA, attendance, conduct records, a personal essay and letters of recommendation are primary considerations for acceptance. Performance in an interview may be evaluated as well. Students must have signed approval from a science teacher, guidance counselor and parent/guardian. A physical exam, negative two-step tuberculosis skin test or TB blood test, proof of Hepatitis B vaccination, and a cleared criminal record check must be obtained prior to entrance into the program. A seasonal flu shot is required in the Fall when the vaccine is available. Students are responsible for providing their own transportation.
